20 Years of Community-Informed Impact Across Colorado

El Pomar Foundation's place-based grant making program, Regional Partnerships, seeks to proactively address local community needs through grant making informed by community member recommendations. The Foundation launched the program in 2003 to increase its impact and establish deep-rooted connections throughout Colorado. Today, the program convenes community leaders into 11 regional councils that advise the Foundation's Trustees and make grant recommendations to address the greatest issues facing their regions. Now a distinctive cornerstone of El Pomar's grant making, this community-informed approach has dramatically increased the Foundation's number of grants in rural Colorado and its impact around the state.
